- A. The gospels tell multiple stories of Jesus healing the sick (Mt. 9:35-36; Jn. 20:30-31; 21:25).
- B. The _____ performed miracles through His name (Mt. 10:8; Acts 3:6; 4:10, 17-18; 5:40).
- C. Jesus is the Great Physician (Mk. 2:17; Lk. 19:10)!

II. There is salvation in the name of Jesus.

- A. There is no other name that permits salvation (Mt. 1:21; Acts 4:12).
- B. Through His name, we possess the command for discipleship (Mt. 28:19).
- C. Only through baptism in His name are we forgiven of sin (Acts 2:38; Acts 8:12; Acts 22:16).
- D. There is no other way to _____ on His name, but as He commands (Rom. 10:13; Mk. 16:16).

III. There is hope of transformation in the name of Jesus.

- A. "And such were some of you...but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus..." (I Cor. 6:11).
- B. "Whatever you do in word or deed, do _____ in the name of the Lord Jesus." (Col. 3:17).
- C. We are a changed people because of Jesus (Gal. 2:20; Rom. 12:1-2).

IV. We can pray in His name!

- A. "No man comes to the Father, but by Me" (Jn. 14:6).
- B. "There is one _____ between God and men, the Man Christ Jesus" (I Tim. 2:5-6).
- C. The Christians prayer avails much, when we pray as we've been instructed (Jam. 5:16).

Conclusion:

Preparing for Worship at Home

If you asked me at the beginning of March if I'd be writing an article about this, I would've told you, "Get out of here!" But here we are, scattered for quarantine, and preparing for the first Sunday of worship in our homes.

Instead of assembling in our building, we are assembling ourselves together for worship online. No, this is not ideal. And yes, I would much rather see you face to face. But I'd also like to grab your hand and hug your necks, but we all know that's not best either.

The elders have arranged for worship to begin at 9:30 A.M. Sunday. We will be led in worship by various men of our congregation. We will sing, pray, observe the Lord's Supper, lay by in store, and hear preaching from God's Word. As always, we seek to offer our worship to God "in spirit and truth" (John 4:23-24). This Sunday, among others, will be no different.

To assist in this, I'd like to offer some suggestions for your consideration.

- 1) Plan the night before how you will view the worship service.** For large families, huddling around a mobile device may not be the most comfortable format for viewing. If you have a way to mirror the service on your TV screen, that may be the best way for everyone in your family to gather around to participate.
- 2) Keep your normal routine for Sundays.** Get up early enough to get ready. Lay your Bible out and have the Lord's Supper elements prepared ahead of time. Be respectful of our God and prepare yourself for the day.
- 3) Start the livestream early.** We will begin the livestream feed at approximately 9:20-9:25 A.M. on Sunday. Make sure the video and audio connections are coming through alright. If you're tuning in via Facebook Live, type a quick greeting to all the brethren who have joined you (Romans 16:16).
- 4) Fully participate in each act of worship.** Fully engage in the worship by singing and praying with understanding (I Corinthians 14:15). Concentrate on the body and blood of the Lord when partaking of the proper elements (I Corinthians

11:23-26). Flip to the pages of Scripture as the preacher leads us in Biblical thoughts (Acts 17:11). Lay aside your contribution for the act of giving (I Corinthians 16:1-2) for the local congregation.

- 5) Encourage others to worship with us.** We have always encouraged visitors to join us for worship. This is no different. Ask you friends to watch with you (social distancing of course) and send them the link. As always, they will be our honored guests!

Most of these suggestions are good to consider under normal circumstances too. I hope you will give consideration to these things as we worship this Sunday.

Discussion:

I. Walking by faith.


- A. Walk by faith and not by sight (II Cor. 5:7).
- B. FAITH comes by hearing the Word of God (Rom. 10:17).
- C. The path of God is found in the Word of God (Psa. 119:105).

II. Walking in the light.


- A. God is light and in Him is no darkness at all (I Jn. 1:5-10).
- B. Take note of the contrast between light and darkness (Jn. 3:18-21; Jn. 17:17; Jn. 8:32).
- C. Walk as children of light (Eph. 5:8; Jn. 1:13; Rom. 12:1-2).

III. Walking by the Spirit (Galatians 5:16ff).

- A. Walking by the Spirit of God does not mean that He miraculously leads me.
- B. Nor does it mean that He, the Spirit, interposes a thought in my heart OR nudges me to do a particular thing. The fruit of the Spirit" and the "works of the flesh" will be evident by the direction we walk.
