I. The problem.

- A. Man has devised his own path of morality and happiness (Jer. 10:23; II Tim. 4:3-4; Rom. 1:18, 28).
- B. The privileges exclusive to marriage have been defiled (Heb. 13:4).
- C. Men and women are leaving God out of their joining (Gen. 2:18ff; Mt. 19:4-6).

Roadblocks To Heaven

Have you ever encountered a roadblock in life? I trust that most, if not all, of us have experienced situations in our lives that have indeed hindered us from going somewhere that we intended to go. What was it that got in your way? How did this make you feel? Roadblocks cause disappointment and we miss out on blessings.

It is possible for us to hit roadblocks as Christians too. If we're not careful, there are a number of things that can get in our way of making it to heaven (Hebrews 2:1-4). Certainly none of us want to stumble in this quest. For this reason, we need to identify the roadblocks and seek daily to avoid them.

The traditions of men can keep us from making it to heaven (Matthew 15:1-9). Christians must reject human traditions that are not in harmony with the will of our God. The only authority for our practices in worship and in serving God is His word (II Timothy 3:16f; John 17:17). Other ways are roadblocks.

False teachers set up roadblocks that might cause us to fall short of heaven's reward (Matthew 15:12-14). Jesus said, "Every plant that My heavenly Father did not plant shall be uprooted" (Matthew 15:13). God's people must not allow themselves to be pulled away by unsound teachers (Galatians 3:1-5).

Ungodly living leads many to fall away (Matthew 15:10,11, 17-20). Our Lord taught, "What proceeds out of the mouth, this defiles man" (Matthew 15:11). The heart is the heart of the matter. Impure living generates from an impure heart. Keep yourself unspotted from the world (James 1:26f).

Little faith is a tool that the devil uses to set us off course (Matthew 15:21-28). Jesus often chided His own disciples for having "little faith" (Matthew 6:30; 8:26; 14:31; 16:8; 17:20). In contrast, the Canaanite woman was commended for her "great" faith (Matthew 15:28). Where is your faith?

A person's misguided ways of living might take them away from their eternal reward (Matthew 15:32-39). The context of Matthew 15 reveals that these people were focused on Jesus as they remained with Him. They were hungering and thirsting for spiritual food. We must do likewise.

Brethren, let's strive to avoid the roadblocks that hinder us from entering into heaven's eternal rest. I pray that we "keep on keeping on" until our Lord's return. If we do so faithfully, God promises us a place of comfort and peace in His presence (John 14:1-4).

- F. He must be ready to preach the Word of God always (II Tim. 4:1-2; Rom. 1:16; Acts 20:27).
- G. Without a preacher, souls would be lost (I Tim. 4:12-16; I Cor. 1:18, 21).

II. How shall they hear without a Christian?

- A. Each Christian should have _____ for the lost (Mt. 9:36ff; II Tim. 4:24-26).
- B. Every Christian must grow in knowledge so the lost can be taught (II Pt. 3:16-18; Heb. 5:12-14).
- C. Each Christian must be ready to defend what he believes (I Pt. 3:15).
- D. Christians are called to sing the praises of God (I Pt. 2:5, 9).

III. How shall they hear when God's work is left undone?

- A. The increase of a Christian's faith and growth of Christ's church is accomplished through the work of _____ (I Tim. 4:13-16).
- B. When every part does its share, it results in "growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love" (Eph. 4:11-16).
- C. The church, which is the body, is required to take orders from the Head, who is Christ (Mt. 28:19-20).
