The Bible: Why Do I Need It?

God has communicated His will to mankind. The Bible gives specific claim in II Timothy 3:16 – "*All Scripture is given by inspiration of God.*"

Without the Holy Scriptures, we would have many questions. Has God already communicated His will to man? Is He going to communicate His will to man? Does He long to communicate His will to man? We would feel lost and without hope.

However, the Scriptures are here and need to be taught from childhood (II Timothy 3:15). What benefits do the Scriptures give us today?

Everything God has given in Scripture is written with purpose (II Timothy 3:16f; Romans 15:4)! We have the responsibility to search the Scriptures to find our purpose through them (Acts 17:11; II Timothy 2:15).

From the context of I Timothy 3:16-17, Paul tells Timothy five purposes supplied through the Scriptures.

- 1) Doctrine – teaching that provides a foundation of Divine Truth (Deut. 4:36; Psalms 94:12).
- 2) Reproof – convicting one of sin (Acts 2:37; Hebrews 4:12; Jeremiah 23:29).
- 3) Correction – able to bring one back to an upright state (James 5:19-20).
- 4) Instruction in righteousness – all manners of righteousness (Matthew 6:33; I Timothy 6:11).
- 5) Thoroughly equipped for every good work (Titus 2:14).

These are benefits applicable to all mankind. They only benefit our life, if we are willing to attend to them and make application. They are beneficial because they bring us closer to God. Don't overlook the importance of God's Word being present in your life!

Do All to the Glory of God

I Corinthians 10:14ff

Introduction:

- 1) I Corinthians 10 summary: Learning from the mistakes of others, so that we can bring glory to God.
- 2) Close association with idolatry is dangerous and will make you pay the price.
- 3) Key word: *Koinonia* (sharing, fellowship, partnership).

Discussion:

I. The Jealousy of God (I Cor. 10:14-22).

- A. Christian worship and communion through the Lord's Supper (10:14-17).
- B. Jewish worship and fellowship through altar sacrifices (10:18).
- C. Gentile worship and fellowship with demons through sacrifices (10:20-21).

 - 1) For conscience sake, don't ask questions about meat sold in the market (10:25-26).
 - 2) When you are asked to attend a feast, don't ask the questions about the meat – just eat it (10:27-28).
 - 3) If they tell you it was offered to an idol, don't eat if for their conscience sake (10:29).
